



1. Bursaries and Funds

\$500,000

Interest from invested funds will serve to promote access to studies at Cégep Heritage College, encourage student perseverance despite obstacles, support development of educational projects and provide emergency aid for students with financial hardships.

E.g. transportation, health and family issues, returning to school, and more

2. AccessAbility (Special Needs)

\$200,000

Investing in increased autonomy and equal opportunities by installing automatic doors and acquiring adaptive equipment. The Foundation also wishes to fund increased academic support for students with special challenges, such as learning disabilities, mobility, physical and mental health issues.

3. Teaching Technologies and Equipment

\$300,000

Investing in student creativity, collaboration, goal setting, problem solving and communication skills while assisting the College to provide a safe and stimulating learning environment. Areas that are earmarked for urgent investments are:

- Rugby/Soccer field improvement: drainage and crowning;
- Auditorium audio/visual upgrades;
- Varied sports equipment.






FINANCIAL STATEMENT NOTES EXCERPT

The College sanctioned the creation of the Foundation wherein Letters Patent were granted April 2nd, 2013 and endorsed the holding of a major fundraising campaign. The College agreed to advance funds for start-up, consultant, manpower and operating costs inherent to incorporating the Foundation, preparing and running a major fundraising campaign. On January 14, 2014, the Foundation formalized an agreement with the College, confirming the terms of the agreement wherein the loan does not bear interest and is payable within 5 years of the date of advance.

During the year, the Heritage College advanced no further funds to the Foundation (\$23,099 in 2016), therefore the amount owing to the College remains at \$207,406. The organization plans to begin reimbursement of this loan in the 2017-2018 financial year.
