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### THE CÉGEP HERITAGE COLLEGE FOUNDATION MISSION


The mission of the **Cégep Heritage College Foundation** is to support the College's diverse and innovative community-driven learning experience.

In 2013, our Foundation was created to help the College respond to escalating student needs, and to safeguard initiatives that foster self-esteem and engagement in college life. Considering the challenges arising from a significant increase in admissions versus limited College funding, the Foundation launched a major fundraising campaign on May 7, 2015 with the goal of raising \$1 million dollars over five years. Soon we will be undertaking the last year of our campaign. Volunteers are multiplying efforts to secure the final \$200,000. It is urgent to reach and surpass our objectives as College admissions now exceed 1,300 and student needs increase beyond available funds. More than ever, the community's participation is both indispensable and appreciated.

This report takes you on our Foundation's 2018-2019 journey in support of our community. We are grateful for our supporters and are delighted to have made a significant impact again this year: \$20,850 to "engagement and perseverance bursaries", \$8,884 to emergency psychological & student crisis assistance, \$3,378 to "student projects" and \$15,000 to the expansion of the Brigil Learning Centre.


# HERITAGE COMMUNITY STANDING STRONG TOGETHER

Our community understands that students cannot learn while their primary needs are not met.




# CAROLINE CALOUCHE MEMORIAL BURSARY

# THE BRIGIL LEARNING CENTRE INAUGURATED AT CÉGEP HERITAGE COLLEGE

On August 23, 2018, the College unveiled the renovated, expanded facilities and bestowed a special recognition to BRIGIL by renaming its Learning Centre the *BRIGIL Learning Centre* to honour the exceptional contribution made by BRIGIL to the Cégep Heritage College Foundation's major fundraising campaign. This designation is active for a ten-year period.

As a lead donor of the campaign, Gilles Desjardins of BRIGIL announced in 2015 his commitment to match donations from the Heritage Family to a maximum of \$100,000. The Heritage Family responded favorably and has committed \$91,000 to date.

The primary mission of the Centre is to deliver academic assistance to students in an environment that celebrates learning and excellence. It invites students to develop and learn cooperatively in an expanded facility of 978 square feet.

Historically, the first Learning Centre was established in 1997, thanks to partnerships with teachers, students, Student and Academic Services as to create a dynamic participative environment. Its unique Peer Tutor Program also contributes to the success of this vital centre. Thanks to the College, its Foundation and the community, the newly renovated and expanded Center will allow more students to persevere in their studies, to gain self-esteem and to meet their educational needs.



- At-risk or vulnerable students include young adults returning to school, single parents, students with learning difficulties, mental wellness and mobility challenges.



<sup>\*</sup> Related Party Transactions re Start-up Loan: In 2012, the College explored the feasibility of creating a Foundation and holding a Major Fundraising Campaign. The College sanctioned the creation of the Foundation for which Letters Patent were granted April 2, 2013 and the College endorsed the holding of a major fundraising campaign. The College advanced funds for start-up, consultant, manpower and operating costs inherent to incorporating the Heritage College Foundation, as well as preparing and running the major fundraising campaign. On February 20, 2019, Heritage College approved a resolution to forgive the long-term debt.

# FOUNDATION FAMILY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Members (faculty, professionals, staff, retirees, parents, alumni and students) have close ties to the College and/or its students. In addition, their skills, knowledge and experience support the Foundation Board and the Campaign Committee

As student needs are great, the Committee agreed to follow Maslow's theory to prioritize measures which aid basic needs such as food, lodging, inclusion and financial security.

Proposals sought from the Heritage community were subsequently evaluated and approved by the Foundation's Board. Funds were allocated in the budget for increased number of perseverance bursaries, as well as the establishment and development of entrance bursaries. Financial support was also allocated to inclusion/leadership initiatives, learning disability evaluations, emergency psychological crisis assistance and accessibility for College sports teams.

For the 2018-2019 year, a contribution in the amount of \$15,000 was directed to the renovation of the Learning Centre and a total of \$33,112 was allocated and distributed to Heritage College students in various forms of assistance (bursaries, assistance, projects).

# FUNDS AND BURSARIES SUB-COMMITTEE

The Family Advisory Committee created the Funds and Bursaries sub-committee to assist in the Foundation's mandate to facilitate and support student access to studies at Cégep Heritage College through the creation of bursaries.

Also led by Marc Fricker, the sub-committee revised bursary criteria to expand the Foundation's reach.

The sub-committee established bursaries for students registered in AEC's (1-year attestation) career programs. As well, perseverance bursaries were created, thanks to a generous donation by the City of Gatineau, to support students who have recently moved to Gatineau to attend Heritage College.

In total, \$21,000 in perseverance, determination and commitment bursaries were awarded to student applicants.

A huge thank you to the bursary selection committee who worked diligently evaluating the numerous application submissions to select the 50 Foundation bursary recipients.
